Vilkas Update

Fresh of the grand final win of the Winter 2023 season Vilkas came into the Summer season with high hopes. Unfortunately, before the season even kicked off, our key attacking wing Matthew Grecl was deemed out for the season with an ACL tear. After some careful negotiation the team was pleased to add big man Lukas Sadauskas to the roster to help plug the gap. With a new look team on the floor at the halfway point in the season Vilkas was sitting in 5th on the ladder and in striking distance of finals. Sadly, once again tragedy struck with man mountain Vyt Vilkaitis being taking out with major rib injuries that made him unavailable for the rest of the season. Shortly after this to add further insult injury Benny (big cat) Katauskas was also taken out with a major calf injury that saw him also sidelined.

In spite of the setbacks the team never lost hope. One game of particular note was the 2nd last game of the season against the number one team '1 in the bucket'. Register to Vote

On 12 May, the Lithuanian Presidential election, and a compulsory referendum on the retention of citizenship will be held. Voters who have registered to vote in the Presidential election will be deemed to have registered for the referendum. European Parliament elections will be held on 9 June. On 13 October, regular elections to the Seimas are scheduled, and on 27 October, a possible re-vote in the single-mandate constituency of the Lithuanian World Parliament.

Don't forget to <u>register to vote online</u> before mid-April. All voters who intend to vote abroad by post or in person will need to register. You can register and vote with an expired passport or identity card.

Restoration of the State Speech

On Monday 5 February, the community celebrated the Restoration of the State of Lithuania (V16), the with the Embassy, hosted at the Embassy. President of the Australian Lithuanian Community, Rasa Mauragis gave a moving speech, which is copied below.



The independence act signed on 16 February 1918 announced to the world that Lithuania was a democratic and independent country. However, this was short lived. Many of us are living in Australia because our parents escaped the occupation by the Soviet Union. We are reminded on this occasion of the efforts made by our parents to ensure that we maintained our Lithuanian heritage and language, and of the efforts made to help Lithuania regain its independence. Whilst those born in Lithuania, and now call Australia home, are reminded of their own or their parents experiences as Lithuania regained its independence.

This day is very special to all Lithuanians spread across the world. Lithuania today is independent so let us commemorate this momentous day with joy. At the same time, let's remember that all of us, regardless of where we live in the world, are part of Lithuania and are responsible for what sort of future our Lithuania will create in the future. Its freedom is not guaranteed especially considering the Ukrainian war that has continued for the past two years and the unrest around the world.

Happy national independence and restoration day to everyone. Let's be strong together by maintaining our ethnic identity and supporting the Ukrainian efforts to maintain their independence as the future of our nation could be decided by the struggles in the world today. Vardan Lietuvos!

Member Vida Viliunas spent the first part of 2024 in West Africa with other doctors from around the word performing surgeries as part of Mercy Ships. Vida told us that "There is a lot of goitre in West Africa due to a combined effect of diet and genetics. That produces large neck tumours challenging anaesthetists and surgeons and

is very rewarding for the difference it makes to a patient's life."

One of the doctors Vida volunteered with was an ophthalmic surgeon name Paulius Rudalevičius from Vilnius. Vida and Paulius performed paediatric eye surgery together.

Vida also said "was also a lot of rickets (due to vitamin D deficiency and poor Calcium absorption) and I worked with a paediatric orthopaedic team from England. I was there for a total of 3 weeks - living on the hospital ship and also covering the surgical and medical wards after-hours."
